Miller Auditorium houses the University theatre department and is a non-union house.

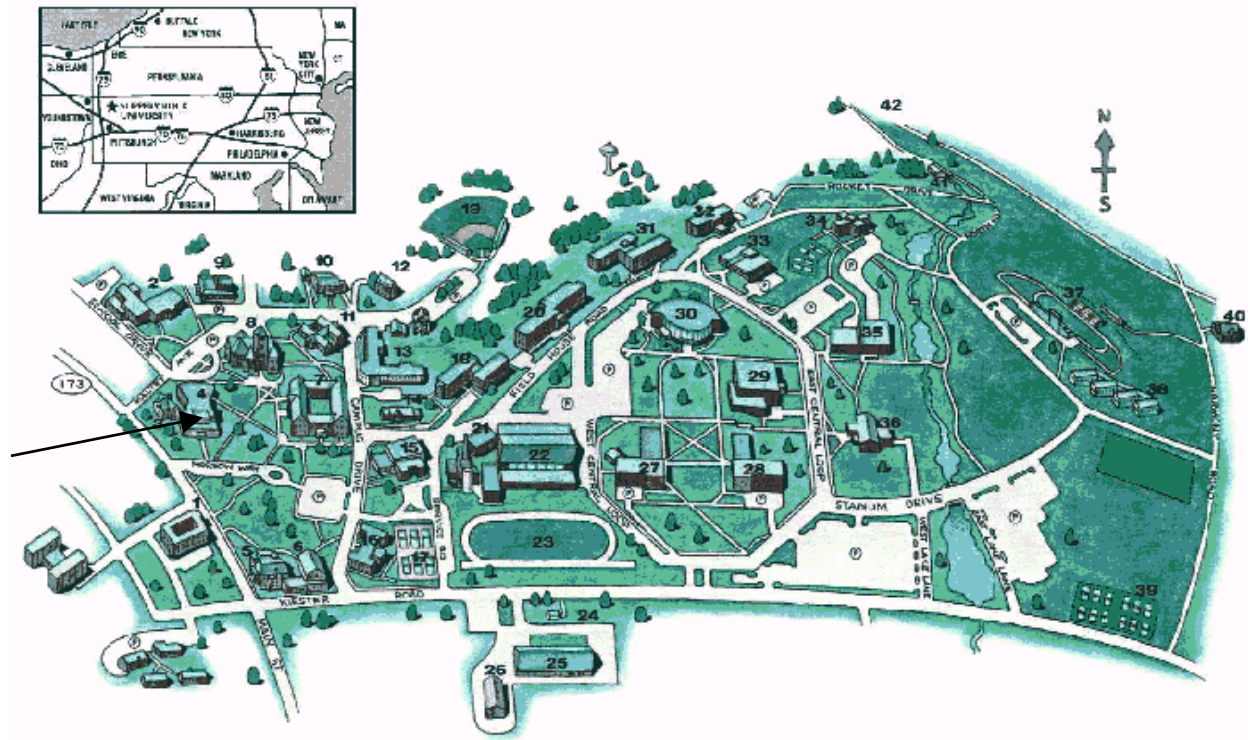

Stage Door

LOADING DOCK	Outdoor space for one 45' Semi-Trailer to unload. Dock height is 3'10" and covered with steel grate. There is a 1" rise to the stage level.
TRUCK PARKING	Arrangements can be made for overnight parking or daytime street parking. Please notify us in advance for these arrangements.
LOADING DOOR ACCESS	Roll up garage door, 9'-11" high x 12'-0" wide. Enters into scene shop.
STAGE DOOR ACCESS	Door from scene shop to stage enters U.S.C. and is in line with the loading dock door. Door opening is 12'-0" high x 10'-0" wide.

STAGE DIMENSIONS	Center stage to S.R. wall - 33'-0" Center stage to S.L. wall - 37'6"
STAGE FLOOR	Tongue and groove 2" Douglas Fir on 2x4 sleepers laid into concrete. No traps or elevators available. Stage is painted black and was refinished 5/03.
CROSSOVER	The scene shop acts as a stage crossover space for performances that need to use the full stage space.
SEATING	Continental seating on the main floor for 892, no balcony. Distance from the stage to the rear seats is approximately 77'-0".

RIGGING	32 scenery line sets. Battons are 60'-0" long schedule 80 pipe. Arbor capacity is 750lbs (avg.) above pipe weight. 5 electrics line sets. Battons are 60'-0" long double hung pipes with permanently mounted electric raceways. Arbor capacity is 660lbs (avg.) above pipe weight. 5500lbs of stage weight available when line sets are empty.

**MILLER AUDITORIUM
Lighting**

HOUSE SYSTEM	Whole Hog 3PC control console. 192 Strand CD-80 2.4k dimmers, dimmer per circuit. Console is located FOH in the control booth. Onstage remote is available.
COMPANY SWITCHES	Company switch located U.S.L. 400 amp, 208 volt, 3 phase, 4 wire supply. There is an alternative 100amp, 3 phase, 4 wire supply, breaker, on S.R.
HOOK-UP	All electrical connection must be made by a Slippery Rock University staff electrician. Connection to the company switch is by mechanical clamps to bear wire pigtailed. Connection to S.R. service is via an unusual connector, or the University staff electrician can make the connection directly to the breaker.
CIRCUIT CONNECTIONS	The house system in all 2p&g stage pin receptacles. All house units are equipped with 2p&g stage pin plugs.

CIRCUIT LOCATIONS

Two front of house positions.

FOH 1 is a 60'-0" long 12x12 Thomas truss on three chain motors hung just below the auditorium ceiling. Circuits are cabled down from above. FOH 1 is 26'-3" from truss to stage floor and 18'-0" from plaster line.

FOH 2 is a permanently hung and circuted truss-work position accessed by ladder. FOH 2 is 16'-0" from pipe to stage floor and 42'-0" from the plaster line.

SR & SL Side slot positions are 20'-0" from the plaster line.

After receiving and reviewing your light plot we will contact you to discuss any circuiting requirements unique to your production.

FOLLOW SPOTS

(2) Lycian LONG THROW AVAILABLE. Located in the control booth at the rear of the house, approximately 120' to the downstage edge of the stage.

The rep plot instruments are not always available for incoming productions based on other events that may be booked in the auditorium.

Audio

ACOUSTICS

House acoustics are excellent! Sound reinforcement is probably not necessary.

HOUSE EQUIPMENT

The sound desk is an Allen and Heath GL3300, 32x8x2 with 8 aux sends, a 12x2 matrix, and 4 mute groups. Permanent speakers consist of a center cluster hung D.S.C. (2 Ramsa WS-T215), 2 Renkus-Heinz TRX 121/9 hung on either side of the proscenium opening, and 2 Renkus-Heinz TRX 81/12 effects/fill speakers hung on the back wall of the auditorium. Additional speakers are available for onstage monitors or fill.

Playback equipment consists of a Numark CDN30 dual well cd player, Tascam 322 dual well cassette deck, and (2) Sony MDS-E58 minidisk player/recorders.

Recording is possible to either our Tascam 700 CDR cd recorder, the Tascam 322 cassette player/recorder, or to the Sony MDS-E58 minidisk player/recorders.

Microphones inventory is (8) AKG wireless lavalieres, (2) AKG wireless handheld, (6) Shure Beta 58a, (6) Shure Beta 57a, (4) Shure 57, and (6) Crown Pcc-160 boundary microphones.

COMMUNICATION

A 4 channel Clear Com system is available throughout the theatre.

Stage monitor and paging is available to the dressing rooms and the green room.

STAGE MANAGER

BOOTH

Stage managers are normally located in the control booth at the rear of the house. A telephone, Clear Com communication and paging to the stage and performer areas available. Accommodations can be made for placing the stage manager backstage with advanced notice.

DRESSING FACILITIES

YELLOW ROOM

Stage right - 6 to 8 positions with mirrors, make-up lights, chairs, toilets and sinks. This room is also the theatre department costume shop, so it also includes 4 sewing machines, cutting tables, and irons and ironing boards. It also contains laundry facilities. Use of the sewing machines, irons, and laundry must be arranged in advance.

GREEN ROOM

Stage left - Furnished with chairs and a bathroom with toilets, sinks, and mirrors.

A mirror assembly for eight can be set-up in the green room or scene shop for additional space as needed. You must arrange with us in advance for this.

MONITORS

All above spaces have house monitors and paging.

**RULES ON HOW WE DO IT HERE . . .
PLEASE!**

LATE SEATING

As a courtesy to our audience, we ask that all performances allow two late seating opportunities (at approximately 5 and 15 minutes), to be mutually agreed upon.

HOUSE ACCESS

Access to the audience during performance by company members is by ticket only and subject to house late seating policy.

BACKSTAGE ACCESS

Members of the audience are not allowed on stage or backstage at time before, during, or after the performance.

PARKING

Parking at the rear of the auditorium for the load-in and load-out is convenient and almost always accessible. Hassle free all day parking for trucks, buses, and vans can be arranged with sufficient notice.

PHOTOGRAPHY OR RECORDING

Are not permitted in the auditorium without the express consent of the Theatre Department.

SIGNS AND DECORATION

Decorations and/or signs shall not be placed in any rooms, hallways, lobbies, or theatre in the building without the permission of the Facilities Manager.

Any damages or defacement by the improper mounting of signs or posters will be paid for the parties whom mounted them.

SECURITY

Valuables should not be left in dressing rooms or the green room. We recommend that the stage manager of the production collect all valuables and keep them during performances. Miller Auditorium is accessed by many groups of people throughout the day.

SMOKING RULES

Miller Auditorium is a smoke free building, no smoking is allowed anywhere in the building.

SAFETY

We insist upon safe working procedures in our productions and enforce certain requirements, including the use of safety cables on all lighting instruments. We must have at least one week's notice if your production intends to make use of guns, whether fired or not, smoke or other pyrotechnic effects, including open flames, strobe or laser light effects, or any other devices with a clear potential for harm.

LAUNDRY

Visiting companies may arrange in advance for the use of the Theatre Departments laundry equipment during their visit. Please launder only those items that are necessary for your performance. Miller Auditorium does not provide laundry detergent.

OTHER

A six-piece Wenger choral or small ensemble shell is available for use. We are equipped with a Telex Sound Enhancement System to provide assistance to hearing-impaired audience members.

A motorized projection screen (20' W - 13' H) is mounted on the house side of the proscenium arch. There is no projection equipment routinely stored in the auditorium.

FINALLY

Performance groups requiring substantial unloading and/or strike support are urged to request it from the local sponsor of your event, not the Facility Manager of the auditorium. Miller auditorium has a small student staff that is used for auditorium events, but additional help beyond that is not available from the auditorium staff.

We do not do publicity, promotion, or house management (including ticket taking, ushering, merchandising). The local sponsor of your event is responsible for these.

We do not build or paint scenery, make sound effects, or search for props or costumes for visiting performance groups. With sufficient notice we will help you to find local sources of consumables (dry ice, flowers, etc.) for your event.

PYROTECHNICS

University safety office consent will be required, in advance, for flash, smoke, haze and other pyrotechnic effects.
